#### EESW STEM day generates success with pupils



On Thursday 12th June, pupils from Year 8 who had performed well within the subject of Design Technology were involved in an engineering day which was run by EESW STEM Wales and the Technology Department.

This was an activity designed to stimulate the interest of young people in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics by providing a task set in an enjoyable and real-world context with links to outside industries.

The task involves teams of up to three pupils assembling and testing models of wind turbines to demonstrate how energy is transferred.

Each turbine can be adapted in terms of gear layout, blade

design, number and size of blades. The voltage output was measured for each turbine using a multimeter.

The turbines were tested against each other and the winning teams were awarded with a prize. Every pupil received a certificate from STEM Wales to add to their 'records of achievement' file.



#### Remembering Sidney Goldberg



Ten pupils from Year 7 and 8 have been taking part in the national 'Sidney Goldberg Memorial Competition'. Sidney Goldberg was a German Jew who escaped to London in 1933, but ended up working as an 'interceptor' for the R.A.F. Wireless Unit during World War II. Goldberg's work proved vital

for the heroic R.A.F. pilots throughout the war, but especially on D-Day in June 1944 which was a turning point for the Allied Forces.

The family of Sidney Goldberg have organised a memorial competition which required pupils to enter a piece of written

or artistic work about the D-Day Landings.

Some fabulous work was produced including poems, newspaper articles, letters, drawings and artistic displays.

### Bon Voyage



In May, a group of thirty Year 10 pupils studying Leisure & Tourism visited Paris to experience French culture first hand.

During the trip, the pupils visited a number of attractions; they walked down the Champs Elysées to the Arc de Triomphe de l'Étoile, took in the wonderful view of Paris from the Eiffel Tower and admired the French gothic architecture of the Notre Dame Cathedral.

The trip provided the pupils with an insight into French culture and allowed them to experience some of the many different visitor attractions in Paris.



In June, 80 Year 7 pupils visited 'Château Beaumont', south Normandy for a fun and exciting activity weekend to soak up the French culture and practise their linguistic skills.

Pupils were entertained in a French themed evening with tasters of snails and frog legs and they were also able to show off their talents in a talent contest.

They thoroughly enjoyed the visits to a local French market in the village of Laval and Le Mont Saint-Michel, not forgetting the end to a fantastic weekend with a day in Euro Disney.
