GCSE Results

A comprehensive report of GCSE results achieved last year will be available within the Governors Annual Report to Parents in November. We continue to be one of the best performing schools in Wales and have the highest GCSE pass rate (A*-C) in Neath Port Talbot.

- 99% of our pupils achieved the equivalent of 5 GCSEs at A*-C
- 82% of our pupils achieved at least 9 GCSEs at A*-C
- 76% of our pupils achieved at least 10 GCSEs at A*-C
- 23 pupils gained 8 or more GCSEs at A* or A grade

No pupils have left Cwmtawe in the last six years without a recognised qualification.

HONOURING THE WELSH HEROES

Year 10 pupil, Joe Lewis was awarded the honour of taking part in a special ceremony to commemorare the Welsh war dead. He was the only youngster across South Wales to be invited to give a reading in Ypres for those killed during the First World War.

A special service was held at the Menin Gate to mark the commemoration of the start of World War 1. The service was part of the unveiling of a new Welsh national memorial at Flanders.

Cwmtawe School announced as official Swans Academy partner

We are delighted to have formed an exclusive partnership with Swansea City Football Club to provide the education for their Premier League Academy Programme. Talented young football players from across South Wales, the UK and overseas will benefit from the quality of teaching that education watchdog ESTYN deemed 'sector-leading' in October 2012.

The Academy operates a full-time and part-time programme. The full-time players will attend Cwmtawe School in the morning and train at the new state-of-the-art academy facility in Landore every afternoon. Those on the part-time programme will be taught by Cwmtawe staff at the academy for one day a week in between their training.

Swans Academy Manager Nigel Rees says the partnership is a very exciting opportunity and will help players continue to develop.

"The education process of any young footballer is an integral part of their development," he said.

"I am delighted that we are working with Cwmtawe Community School to deliver our education programme and give us the necessary platform to work towards category one status."



Designed to achieve



Sixty pupils in Year 10 studying Design Technology yet again surpassed all expectations. Despite completing a two-year Resistant Materials course in half that time, they achieved a pass rate of 90% at A*-C, with a quarter achieving at A* or A grade.

Nearly fifty Year 11 pupils who had achieved similar success in Year 10 went on to achieve another GCSE in Graphic Products this year, with a 94% success rate at A*-C and nearly a third gaining this qualification at A* or A grade.



Picture perfect performance



The following pupils have all passed their Art & Design GCSE a year earlier than expected.

Forty-six pupils were entered and gained an A*-C. In addition, half of these achieved at A* or A grade.

These talented artists will now go on to study a further GCSE in either Art Graphics or Fine Art.

Succeeding in Science



All pupils in Cwmtawe now study a 'Double Science' or a 'Triple Science' qualification

Our Year 10 pupils have completed their first science GCSE and achieved exceptional outcomes. 72% achieved an A*-C grade, with 27 pupils gaining an A* or A grade.

They are now studying their second science qualification and nearly fifty triple scientists will continue on to a third GCSE by the end of Year 11.



Pupils and staff dress up to raise money

The Annual PTA Fun Run has become a key event in our school calendar. In fact, some of our new Year 7 pupils have been planning their costumes since before they started school! Both pupils and staff make the effort to dress up and raise money for the PTA, having great fun in the process as can be seen from the images below.

These funds are put to good use to enhance provision for your children. For example, over the last three years, the PTA has funded resources, pupil rewards, presentations and three new minibuses, allowing your children to be transported to events in safety and style.



North to South

Sixteen staff from Cwmtawe took part in their annual challenge, this year to raise money for the Amanda Hodson Pupil Welfare Fund and Teenage Cancer Trust.

Day one involved climbing Mount Snowdon followed by a 160 mile cycle ride from Penmachno to Pontardawe. Over £5,000 has already been raised with donations coming in every day.
