Celebrating GCSE Success

A comprehensive report of GCSE results achieved last year will be included in the Governors' Annual Report to Parents in November. We continue to be one of the best performing schools in Wales and have the highest GCSE pass rate (A*-C) in Neath Port Talbot.

- 98% of our pupils achieved the equivalent of 5 GCSEs at A*-C
- 79% of our pupils achieved at least 9 GCSEs at A*-C
- 71% of our pupils achieved at least 10 GCSEs at A*-C
- 27 pupils gained 8 or more GCSEs at A* or A grade

No pupils have left Cwmtawe in the last six years without a recognised qualification.

Designed to achieve



DESIGN TECHNOLOGY TECHNOLEG

Forty-one pupils in Year 10 studying Design Technology yet again surpassed all expectations. Despite completing a two-year Resistant Materials course in half that time, they achieved a pass rate of 85% at A*-C, with a quarter achieving at A* or A grade.

Fifty-seven Year 11 pupils who had achieved similar success in Year 10 went on to achieve another GCSE in Graphic Products this year, with a 88% success rate at A*-C and nearly a third gaining this qualification at A* or A grade.



A picture perfect performance



The pupils pictured have all passed their Art & Design GCSE a year earlier than expected.

Twenty-one pupils were entered and gained an A*-C. In addition, two thirds of these achieved at A* or A grade.

These talented artists will now go on to study a further GCSE in either Art Graphics or Fine Art.

Succeeding in science



All pupils in Cwmtawe now study a 'Double Science' or a 'Triple Science' qualification

Our Year 10 pupils have completed their first science GCSE and achieved exceptional outcomes. 74% achieved an A*-C grade, with 29 pupils gaining an A* or A grade.

They are now studying their second science qualification and nearly fifty triple scientists will continue on to a third GCSE by the end of Year 11.



Pupils and staff dress up to raise money

The Annual PTA Fun Run has become a key event in our school calendar. In fact, some of our new Year 7 pupils have been planning their costumes since before they started school! Both pupils and staff make the effort to dress up and raise money for the PTA, having great fun in the process as can be seen from the images below.

These funds are put to good use to enhance provision for your children. For example, over the last three years, the PTA has funded resources, pupil rewards, presentations and three new minibuses, allowing your children to be transported to events in safety and style.



Work Experience Week

Year 10 pupils took part in work experience week from 13th to the 17th July 2015.

It proved an extremely successful week with the majority of the year group gaining placements in a wide range of local organisations including local primary schools, council offices, plumbing companies, major retailers and local shops, dog kennels, South Wales Police (police dog training), crèches, solicitors, The Grand Theatre, banks, riding stables, hairdressers, restaurants, graphic designers, factories, construction companies and Buffoon film and media.

Pupils who were not able to arrange placements during the work experience week attended a number of activities within the school to develop work related skills. Activities included:

- learning about the world of work and developing work skills through role play, games and dance during a 'Positive Steps' workshop delivered by Tan Dance;

- a one-day work shop (delivered by school staff) on searching and applying for jobs, including completing application forms, creating a Curriculum Vitae and preparing for an interview;

- developing a pizza business through an enterprise session delivered by 'Base Wales';





- designing and creating willow objects in the school drama studio including a willow version of the school logo delivered by 'Out to Learn Willow'.
