As part of their preparations, pupils were mentored by two barristers from Iscoed Chambers and also had the opportunity to visit Swansea Magistrates' Court to get a taste of advocacy. Pupils excelled, winning 2 of their 3 heats against sixth form teams.









An Afternoon with Jasper Fforde

On Tuesday 24th November, pupils from 9B and 9C went for an 'Afternoon with Jasper Fforde' in Pontardawe Library. This established and published author spoke to the classes about what it is like to be an author, his rise to fame and his latest novel 'Dragonslayer 3'. Jasper also read out sections from the pupils' own fantasy and horror stories and gave out prizes for the ones he judged to be best. Ten pupils were awarded signed, first-edition copies of Mr Fforde's new novel while the top three overall winners were also given gift vouchers for 'Waterstones'. Mr Fforde chose Melanie Ward's horror story 'Whispers on the Beach', Georgia Cornwall's brooding narrative 'The Dark Secret' and Oscar Cox's haunting tale entitled 'Dark Forest.'

Mr Fforde also held a 'Question and Answer' session with the pupils and afterwards, during refreshments, all pupils were given library cards and made 'Friends of the Library.' Our thanks goes to Pontardawe Library and Mr Fforde himself - hopefully some of our more reluctant readers will now dive into the wonderful world of fiction.

Cwmtawe Pupils Extend a Helping Hand

Pupils at Cwmtawe have taken part in two charity events to raise money for a school in Nepal which was devastated by the earthquake earlier this year. The groups climbed the highest mountain in South Wales, Pen y Fan, and cycled 30 miles from Pontardawe to Mumbles and back, raising over £1,000. The money will be donated to Mahendra Jyoti Higher Secondary School "Building Back Better" project. The aim of the project is to build a new earthquake resistant school with improved facilities, teacher training and resources which will provide the pupils with a better educational environment and future opportunities.



International Education Week

The school celebrated International Education Week by hosting language and business experts promoting the advantages of learning European languages.

On Tuesday 17th November, Year 9 pupils took part in a variety of workshops involving Business Language Champion Tim Penn, Alex Pickering from Germany's Goethe Institute and Student Language Ambassadors from Cardiff University.

Local businesses were represented by Swansea's award-winning translation business Wolfestone, and one of Pontardawe's major employers Wall Colmonoy. Wall Colmonoy is a global metals business based in the USA which emphasises the importance of languages in its European operations.

Presentation Evenings

Cwmtawe was proud again this year to present awards for the academic triumphs of pupils from across the school in recognition of their hard work over the last academic year.

The Whole School Presentation Evening was on October 22nd and staff, parents, and pupils enjoyed musical items and speeches from our current and outgoing Head Boy and Head Girl.

Every department in the school awarded one hard working pupil with an 'Achievement' prize and another with a 'Progress' award and some pupils also received plaques and cash prizes.

The GCSE Presentation Evening was held on 11th November and was our best attended event ever, with more pupils given awards for earning eight or more GCSEs than ever before.

Drama and History Trip

The Drama and History Department organised a day trip to the Dylan Thomas Theatre in Swansea to watch a play called 'Rosie's War.' This production told the emotional and endearing tale of Rosie Birch, a young girl evacuated from Liverpool to Swansea on the onset of the Second World War. The story followed Rosie during Wartime Wales, as she experienced the blackouts, rationing and the bombing.

After the production pupils went to the National Waterfront Museum. At the museum they participated in various activities designed to further enhance their knowledge and understanding of life on the home front during the Second World War.

The Bin It! roadshow visited the school as part of Cwmtawe's Healthy Schools programme.

Year 7 and 8 pupils enjoyed a dynamic presentation with a hard-hitting message. The school is now looking forward to more recycling and less litter!
