Madyson Delegado-Bellido (Year 10) raised £500 for 'Stand Up For Downs'. Her cousin has Down's Syndrome and she wanted to raise awareness and support a charity that is close to her heart. She has also been an exceptional fundraiser for the year group, being a keen helper during charity week, the school fete, Christmas fair and most recently 'The Macmillan Walk.'

Head girl, Anastasia Stockton (Year 10), was a Senior Peer Mentor, Languages Ambassador, SNAG (School Nutrition Action Group) representative, 5x60 Sports Ambassador and Chairperson of the Whole School Council. She received 10 awards in the School's Presentation Evening last October, which included the Amanda Hodson Community Spirit Award at Key Stage 3. She is also a Neath Port Talbot Youth Council Member and is on the Children's Commissioner Advisory Panel for Wales.

During the Whitsun school holidays pupils competed in the Urdd National Eisteddfod. Each individual or group had won the local and county preliminary rounds to represent West Glamorgan in this national event. We had to be up at the crack of dawn to start our journey to the festival field in Bridgend.

Having competed against thirteen in the group recitation for Welsh learners, it was a relief to hear the name of "Ysgol Gymunedol Cwmtawe" amongst the top three in the competition. Pupils would proceed to compete on the stage of the pavilion later that day.

Relatives, friends and supporters followed the competitions on S4C, eagerly awaiting performances by pupils of the school. The group were delighted to win the second prize in the competition.







MATHEMATICS / MATHEMATEG

UK Junior and Intermediate Mathematics Challenge

The UK Mathematics Trust is a registered charity whose aim is to advance the education of children and young people in mathematics. It organises national mathematics competitions for UK secondary school pupils.

The Mathematics Department entered 12 pupils from Year 11, 22 pupils from Year 10 and 12 pupils from Year 9 for the 2017 Intermediate Mathematics Challenge. For the Junior Mathematics Challenge, the department entered 25 Year 8 pupils and 20 Year 7 pupils. The challenge is a national competition to identify the top mathematicians in the country.

From a national entry of over 250,000 pupils for each challenge, only the top 6% receive gold certificates, the next 13% receive silver awards and the following 21% receive bronze awards.

The school's pupils were very successful gaining 1 gold, 12 silver and 18 bronze awards. The successful candidates were:-
