Year 6 pupils recently enjoyed a day of fun activities in preparation for their first year in Cwmtawe. There were two action-packed days at the beginning of February, when they joined us for our Sports Skills Day and Technology Skills Day.

Sports Skills Day consisted of an exciting range of games and activities including rugby, racquet skills and basketball, courtesy of the Physical Education department and our sports ambassadors. It was a welcome taster of physical education and games lessons at Cwmtawe School.



In the Technology Skills Day, pupils took part in skills workshops where they had an opportunity to bake cookies, develop team work as well as weighing and measuring skills. They also discovered how to make a pen holder out of plastic using the line bender, and how to transfer their name to fabric in the textiles workshop.



Cwmtawe School holds several skills days for Year 6 throughout the academic year as part of its primary school transition programme. The days give pupils a chance to experience the varied curriculum at the school, including ICT, music, sports and technology, leading to an induction day in the summer. The events also serve to build relationships and team building skills between pupils of different schools before they join as next year's Year 7. FRENCH / FFRANGEG




