NPT'S YOUNG PEOPLE'S MENTAL HEALTH FORUM / FFORWM IECHYD MEDDWL POBL IFANC

This new mental health board promotes the importance of being kind online. Discussions are centred on young people's mental health and how we as schools can support those struggling. Year 10 pupils Joe Flint and Elinor Aiden represent the school on this board and feed back to pupils in Cwmtawe.



FLOURISH

The Flourish Project is a project designed to help young people develop healthy self-esteem as well as mental and emotional well-being. Research proves that there is a correlation between students' mental wellbeing and their academic progress. Happy children thrive and unhappy children do not achieve their full potential. This programme is run as hour sessions by a trained facilitator over eight weeks. Topics covered are beliefs, mindset, social media, self-esteem, dreams and aspirations, goal setting. The project gives staff a clearer understanding of some of the key concepts about pupils' wellbeing.

The project is sponsored by Edenstone Foundation.

YEAR 7 - MEET THE FORM TUTOR / BLWYDDYN 7 -CYFARFOD YR ATHRAWON DOSBARTH

"Meet the Form Tutor" evening was introduced this year to provide parents with an opportunity to meet their child's form tutor, provide feedback about how their child has settled into Cwmtawe School and answer any other questions that parents had. Parents were also able to visit their child's form room and communal area and meet other key staff.

PEER MENTORING / MENTORA CYFOEDION

Every Year 7 pupil has had the opportunity to meet with a peer mentor during a registration session. Year 7 pupils were able to have a one to one session to discuss their personal journey in moving from primary to secondary school and to find out about the extra-curricular activities available. Peer mentors also offer extra support within the school. There was a wonderful atmosphere in all sessions.



2022 GCSE RESULTS / CANLYNIADAU TGAU

This is the first year that pupils have taken formal examinations since 2019 and more than eight out of ten pupils in last year's Year 11 achieved 5A*- C grades, with two thirds also achieving this with English, Mathematics and Science. Over a quarter achieved five or more GCSEs at the highest A* or A grade level.

Delighted headteacher, Mr. Lee Hitchings reported to the media last Summer that "the whole school community is celebrating. These are excellent results for Cwmtawe Community School in what has been an extremely difficult two years, due to unprecedented disruption to their education."

"This has been an excellent year group - the results are thoroughly deserved, reflecting the hard work of pupils, teachers and support staff. I'm sure that parents will be very proud of the young people's achievements, and we wish our students well as they go on to further education or start other careers".

At Cwmtawe, a whole week is dedicated to raising awareness of the importance of languages. Pupils enjoyed meals with a European theme in the school dining hall and took part in quizzes during registration. Staff and pupils were also encouraged to greet each other in different European languages to celebrate, respect and learn more about the diverse cultures within Europe. In addition to this, there was also a European Day of Languages 'showstopper bake off' competition which pupils thoroughly enjoyed creating at home. 1st prize went to Cai Lewis in Year 7, 2nd prize went to Oscar Horne in Year 8 and 3rd prize was shared by Poppy Haggerty and Chloe Mansell in Year 9. Some Year 7 pupils also completed a flag hunt around the school building to discover different greetings in a variety of languages.

Two pupil language ambassadors from Year 10 (Madeleine Herdman and Isabelle Jones) also did a fantastic job of delivering key stage 3 assemblies throughout the week. The opportunity to apply to become a pupil language ambassador has now been opened up to Year 9 pupils.

During modern foreign language lessons pupils had the opportunity to 'dress up' and have their photos taken in 'photo booth' style and staff played their part by arranging a coffee morning on the Friday, with delicious snacks from all parts of Europe which raised over £100 for Macmillan's Cancer Appeal.

7U, now 8U have also been corresponding with pupils in a school in France. 7U received letters from them and have since sent letters back out to them. Now in 8U, pupils are eagerly awaiting a second response. Pupils both in France and Cwmtawe were thrilled to receive letters.

SEREN NETWORK / RHWYDWAITH SEREN

Seren is a Welsh Government initiative dedicated to helping Wales' brightest students achieve their full academic potential and support their education pathway into leading universities in Wales, the UK, and overseas. Many pupils from Cwmtawe have been fortunate to benefit from this project. Here is a report by 3 of our pupils.

Hello, I am Emma Thomas and I am in Year 10. I am grateful to be part of the Seren Network and have so many creative opportunities. The Seren Masterclasses take place once a week and the majority are online but there are some face-to-face sessions which are great as we can mix with new people from other schools. I decided to take psychology as I wanted to have the chance to learn about something new that I may not be able to do in the future. So far, we have learnt about the brain, phobias and different types of therapies. This is very interesting as we do lots of fun and



interactive tasks which allows us to have a good time whilst learning. I have a great teacher who is very enthusiastic about her subject. I have enjoyed learning about how the brain works and how it can affect people's thoughts and acts. I am excited to continue learning more about the human mind and behaviour in the near future.

Hello, I am Seren Thair and I am a Year 10 pupil in Cwmtawe and have been taking part in a series of opportunities with the Seren Network. Out of the many different options of masterclasses for the Autumn term, I chose humanities which covers topics in geography and history, both of which I'm exceedingly passionate about and took as my GCSE options. For the past 4 weeks I have participated in online classes which have covered geography and from next week forward for another 4 weeks I will start on the History side of my course. Our main focus has been on climate change and how it is affecting our planet and what we as young people can do to reduce these factors at home. I am very grateful to have been offered such a special and beneficial opportunity.

Hello, I'm Sofia Bajada and I chose to do law in the autumn term as I thought it would be a valuable experience to learn a new topic. So far, I have found the course very interesting, and I have particularly enjoyed the face-to-face sessions as we get to interact with new people and visit the college! My favourite thing we have learnt so far is homicide, as I have enjoyed looking at different cases.

Hello, my name is Isabel O'Sullivan. I have been offered the chance once a week to have an online teams call with a physics teacher in St Joseph's sixth form. In these calls we have been speaking about radiation from beta particles and how to block the radiation, as well as magnets and the effects they have on electricity and speakers. We have also been learning about Cern, a science lab in Switzerland which is funded by countries all over the world to help discover more about nuclear physics. These scientists will then give away their findings for free. This has been a very insightful and interesting course and if given the opportunity I would definitely do this again.
