At the beginning of the Summer term, Year 9 students had the opportunity to experience 'The Creation, The Fall and The Flood' delivered by the CiCS (Christians in Cwmtawe School) team. This presentation engaged students with the various religious and non-religious views on creation and enthused them to ask fundamental questions surrounding the creation of the world. Students thoroughly enjoyed being able to explore various aspects of creation such as fossils, evolution and Adam and Eve and how these might impact our lives today. We look forward to the continuation of posing these fundamental questions and delving a little deeper into religious and philosophical themes throughout the Religious Studies GCSE course.

#### **DRAMA**

Year 9 Drama students have been diligently preparing a dramatic presentation depicting the effects of bullying. This moving performance in the school drama studio on June 19 delivered a firm, stark message on how bullying can adversely impact people's lives.





## **MATHEMATICS / MATHEMATEG**

The UK Mathematics Trust is a registered charity whose aim is to advance the education of children and young people in mathematics. It organises national mathematics competitions for UK secondary school pupils.

The Mathematics Department entered 50 pupils from Year 9, Year 10 and Year 11 for the 2019 Intermediate Mathematics Challenge and 50 pupils from Year 7 and Year 8 for the 2019 Junior Mathematics Challenge. The challenge is a national competition run by the United Kingdom Mathematics Trust to identify the top mathematicians in the country.

From a national entry of over 250,000 pupils for each challenge, only the top 6% receive gold certificates, the next 13% receive silver awards and the following 21% receive bronze awards.

The school's pupils were very successful gaining 2 gold, 8 silver and 22 bronze awards. The successful candidates are listed below.

The introduction of a lesson on County Lines, which was delivered by PC Hodges, highlighted a current issue facing young people. The feedback from pupils has been tremendous, they felt that Paul's Pledge proved highly emotive as Paul was a local boy who many of the pupils could identify with. As he says, what happened to him as a result of alcohol induced violence could happen to anyone.

#### Level 2 Award in Work Related Education

A group of six Year 9 pupils were selected to attend the Riverside Centre at Pontardawe.

The group achieved Entry Level 2 Award for Essential Skills for Work and Life by attending the academy over a six month period, taking part in a variety of activities and challenges, both individual and team-based, within the woodland/riverside setting.

To achieve the Level 2 Award in Work Related Education, the pupils, who were split into two groups, designed and made coffee tables, within workshop settings which they constructed themselves.

The group also achieved their Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Award, which included climbing Pen y Fan, a practice Expedition in the Brecon Beacons and the final Expedition in the Gower. The group also took part in activities such as First Aid, Camperaft, Navigation and general outdoor management.





























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#### PEER MENTORS / MENTORIAID

The peer mentors for 2019/2020 were announced following a rigorous application and interview process which attracted over 60 applicants.
