GCSE RESULTS 2019 / CANLYNIADAU TGAU 2019

A comprehensive report of GCSE results achieved last year is available within the Governors' Annual Report to Parents.

- 73% of our pupils achieved the equivalent of 5 GCSE's A*-C.
- 52% of our pupils achieved at least 9 GCSEs at A*-C.
- 45% of our pupils achieved at least 10 GCSEs at A*-C.
- 10% of our pupils gained 8 or more GCSEs at A* or A grade.
- No pupils have left Cwmtawe in the last ten years without a recognised qualification.









As Mr. Hitchings reported to the press on results day "Pupils, staff, governors and parents are celebrating today. It is the pinnacle of five years of hard work and reflects the quality of education offered by the school. We wish pupils well as they embark on the next stage of their education or their chosen career".

EUROS 2020

Year 7 enjoyed their first year group trip to Cardiff City Stadium on 19th November to watch Wales play Hungary in a vital 2020 European qualifier match. Over eighty Year 7 pupils attended and thoroughly enjoyed watching Gareth Bale, Daniel James and Aaron Ramsey, to name but a few. We had a thrilling time eating hot dogs and burgers and singing Welsh songs to cheer our amazing team on. Wales ended up winning 2-0 and qualifying for the European Championships in 2020. KEY STAGE 2 SKILLS DAYS / DYDDIAU SGILIAU CYFNOD ALLWEDDOL 2

Year 6 pupils recently enjoyed a day of fun activities in preparation for their first year in Cwmtawe next year. Pupils took part in creating a radio jingle, a poster and a video presentation to the theme of 'Happy' by Pharrell Williams. The day was packed full of opportunities for our new pop stars and designers to express their creativity.

This was followed by two action-packed days at the beginning of November when they joined us again for our Sports Skills Day and Technology Skills Day.

Sports Skills Day consisted of an exciting range of games and activities including rugby, racquet skills and basketball, courtesy of the physical education department and our sports ambassadors. It was a welcome taster of physical education and games lessons at Cwmtawe School.

On 8th November our technology department ran a very successful Technology Skills Day for 130 pupils from Clydach, Alltwen, Godre'rgraig, Glais and Gwaun Cae Gurwen Primary Schools. Pupils developed their knowledge of forces and the design process while designing a car seat, seat belt and bumper to test what conditions provided the best protection during a crash test. Working in teams of five, pupils engineered, designed and marketed a protection system for their egg. It proved to be an 'eggcellent' day and pupils had a cracking time testing their designs.

Cwmtawe School holds several skills days for Year 6 throughout the academic year as part of its primary school transition programme. The days give pupils a chance to experience the varied curriculum at the school, including ICT, music, sports and technology, leading to an induction day in the summer. The events also serve to build relationships and team building skills between pupils of different schools before they join as next year's Year 7. The skills days are incredibly successful at easing pupils into life at Cwmtawe and are some of the most eagerly anticipated events in our school calendar.



























EUROPEAN DAY OF LANGUAGES / DYDD IEITHOEDD EWROPEAIDD

At Cwmtawe, a whole week is dedicated to raising awareness of the importance of languages. Pupils enjoyed meals with a European theme in the school dining hall and took part in quizzes and other fun events. Snacks from European countries were sampled, with staff and pupils greeting each other in



different European languages. Various activities were held throughout the week, encouraging pupils to celebrate, respect and learn more about the diverse cultures within Europe.

Staff played their part by arranging a coffee morning on the Friday, with delicious snacks from all parts of Europe which also raised funds for Macmillan's Cancer Appeal.

Pupils had a surprise visitor on Thursday 3rd October as Swansea City FC star Aldo Kalulu arrived at the school to join celebrations.

Aldo Kalulu is a French professional footballer of Congolese descent. He is on loan to Swansea City this season from Swiss club FC Basel, and previously played for Lyon in France. He was also a French under-18 international player.

The Swans are well-known for attracting talented footballers from all over the world who have loved making Swansea their home. Indeed, many fans hope that Kalulu will join the Swans permanently at the end of this year's loan period.

Excited Year 10 pupils took part in a question and answer session, asking the player about how much he likes living in Wales and being part of the team. Aldo Kalulu was delighted to join in and support the activities.

As Headteacher, Mr Hitchings, reported to the press during that week "We are proud of the school's links with Swansea City as several academy players are Cwmtawe pupils. We were very pleased to welcome a senior club player who is contributing so much to the Swans' success."
