ATTENDANCE / PRESENOLDEB

High attendance is essential if your son/daughter is to reach his/her potential in school. We ask for your support by:-

- Reinforcing the importance of good attendance and punctuality;
- Liaising with the school as soon as your son/daughter is unwell;
- Ensuring your son/daughter catches up quickly on any missed work;
- · Organising medical or dental appointments outside school hours;
- · Avoiding taking holidays during term time.

90% attendance is the equivalent of missing six months of learning over the five years of secondary school.

80% attendance is the equivalent of missing one year of learning over the five years of secondary school.



ESTYN THEMATIC VISIT / YMWELIAD GAN ESTYN

During the Spring term Cwmtawe received an Estyn Thematic visit. Estyn were extremely impressed with the school and commented on the calm and purposeful atmosphere around the building.

Feedback comments included:

- Strong, caring culture of the school based on wellbeing and high achievement.
- · Positive attitudes to learning demonstrated by pupils.
- A measured approach to new initiatives and developments, to avoid overwhelming pupils and staff.
- Pupil centred approach to all aspects of the school, resulting in high impact.
- High quality work evident in books with meaningful comments and very few gaps.
- Children were able to clearly articulate where they were in their learning and how to improve.
- Pupils really valued effective verbal feedback and spoke extremely positively where this was done well.

Estyn has asked the school to submit two effective practice cameos for publication linked to assessment and quality assurance.




YOUTH SERVICE / GWASANAETH IEUENCTID

Phoebe Davies (8I) will be competing with her team IDM Megacrew, in the World Hip Hop Championships in Arizona on August 6th, representing the UK.




ATHLETICS / ATHLETAU

VISIT TO THE HAY FESTIVAL / YMWELIAD Â GWYL Y GELLI GANDRYLL








END OF YEAR ACTIVITIES / GWEITHGAREDDAU DIWEDD BLWYDDYN
